I am pleased that we continue to move forward with the technology initiative of purchasing and installing the twenty-eight new Promethean ActivPanels. At a cost of just over \$140,000.00 (plus an additional \$10,000.00 for new wiring) this is a huge endeavor and we are counting on each of our Holy Spirit families to support the campaign.

The network cabling for the panels has been completed and we are moving on to the next phase in being certain that the classrooms are ready for the new devices.

The Promethean ActivPanel is an award winning device that is powered by an external Android-based mini PC which can be upgraded over time in order to keep pace with advances in technology.

For our 21st Century Learners interactive technology is as "normal" a part of their learning as the overhead projector was to most of ours. When used well, interactive technology increases teacher-student engagement and has been shown to boost overall performance. Although Holy Spirit School prides itself on maintaining a healthy balance between traditional learning methods and technology-based learning, as an institution that inspires life-long learners and ignites servant-leaders through a program of academic excellence grounded in the traditions and values of the Holy Catholic Church we know that we must keep pace with the changing world of education technology.





Dear Parents/Guardians,

It's time to welcome in the second semester of the school year.

If you would like to purchase lunches for the semester, the cost is \$390.00 and **must be paid online** – under the *Current Families* tab click on the button "Semester Lunch Form". Payments for a full semester of lunches are via credit card through the school's Stripe account.

Monthly menus should be accessed and printed through the school's website – under *Current Families* tab click on "Lunch Menu" button and scroll to the bottom of the page.

The cost for purchasing lunches will be \$5.00 per day. The ordering for daily and/or monthly meals will remain the same procedure as last year – per child, a lunch menu should be returned to the school with choices circled and a check for full payment must be included.

If your child forgets his/her lunch at home or in the classroom the cafeteria staff will provide a lunch for them. You will receive a \$5.00 fee for each occurrence.
