Please note...

I am sending this out early a little earlier in the day today so that you are aware that as we continue our preparations in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, students will be bringing home with them today all of the textbooks and workbooks that they may need should our school be closed moving into next week. I have asked teachers (particularly for the primary grades) to provide guidance to parents as to what may be needed in school tomorrow given we have a half day and I do not want students to carry everything back and forth.

Thank you to the 121 families who have thus far responded to the questionnaire that was sent out yesterday. If you have not completed it, I would ask that you please take two minutes and provide us with the information needed.

If our school is closed, you will receive information as to what the learning expectations are for your children. As you might suppose there will be differences depending on grade levels. Please know that there will not be an expectation that your children will be in front of a screen every day all day but that teachers may include in daily lessons videos that may assist with the explanation of curriculum topics. Additionally there will not be an expectation that students are online at specific times for "live" classes. Faculty will have posted "office hours" in case you or your student have questions. Of interest to you may be the guidance which has been published out of the Chancery offices for the Diocese of Arlington.


