



Peter Ryan is a Catholic husband and father of four who is in the process of founding LookUp4Life, a non-profit organization focused on spreading awareness regarding the negative impact of excess personal technology use (video games, social media, pornography), particularly on the youngest generations.

Parental Warning: We want to make sure parents are fully informed about the content of the Personal Technology Addiction presentation, particularly if they plan on bringing their children. The content will discuss topics such as the impact of excess personal technology usage and its impact on our youth and young adults in particular. For instance, Mr. Ryan discusses its correlation to depression, suicide, and changes in young adult sexual activity levels (i.e., the impact of the excess screen use is strong enough to change sexual activity levels from prior times). Nothing graphic is covered and there will be no images. Additionally, the presentation will discuss strategies to use in the home such as written technology guidelines for the home. Parents need to determine if they want their children to hear this from Mr. Ryan or if they want to be the first to discuss with their children at home. Mr. Ryan's 14-year old daughter has seen the presentation and is comfortable with the material.






