I was thrilled to hear this week about one of our amazing alums! Sam Donovan is technically a sophomore at Bishop O'Connell High School but his love of the global world led him to finding the U.S. Department of State's Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange and Study Abroad (YES Abroad) program. The program provides competitive merit-base scholarships for U.S. citizens in secondary school (ages 15-18.5) to study for one academic year in select countries.

Sam's mom let us know this week he was accepted into the program and left in September for Ghana! He will return to the U.S. in June 2019.

According to his mother, Sam is on the younger side to go as a lot of students go junior/senior year or take it as a gap

year but Sam has always been fascinated by global affairs, languages, travel and has always been impatient to get out in the world.

The program is for one academic year and is spent in one of 15 countries and is fully funded by the State Department. Sam seems to really be enjoying the experience. 
