Health Screening



A note from Mrs. Wild:

Utilizing twenty one, hardworking parent volunteers, 95 students in grades 3 and 7 were successfully screened for vision, hearing, height and weight. Following the completion of their screening, students enjoyed a six station educational opportunity focusing on poisons. Students learned about the prevalence of poisons in the home, as well as the presence and identification of poisonous plants and snakes in Virginia. Students also learned about the unhappy fate of Socrates, forced to carry out his own death sentence by drinking a potion of hemlock. The highlight of the opportunity was a display of "look alike" foods and poisons. Students struggled to identify which was the food, reinforcing the teaching that chemicals should always remain in their original appropriately labeled containers. After learning the Poison Control phone number, students returned to their regular day excited about their experience.


