## I am sure you noticed....



A construction crew has been at work for a couple of days now as the parish continues to prepare for the new edition to the church building. The crew has been widening one portion of the road in front of the school.

As I mentioned previously, we will have a new traffic pattern for the duration of the construction project. It has been decided that the road in front of the church will be closed to thru traffic and the road in front of the school will become a two-way road.

For purposes of drop off and pick up from the lower lot, cars will enter the campus from Woodland Way and will turn left in order to travel down the hill towards the school. Cars will

continue past the school, turn right heading into the lower lot, continue to the top of the hill and then create the same lines we have always had.

It will be very important that no one attempts to "cut corners" across the lower lot; please follow all traffic directional signs.

Students will still be dropped off on the sidewalk in front of the school, exiting the cars only from the right side of the vehicle.

It will be imperative that parents do not attempt to exit their car for safety purposes and in order to not impede the flow of incoming cars.

With regard to afternoon dismissal, nothing will change for prekindergarten, kindergarten or vanpool pickup.

For those who make use of the lower lot for afternoon pickup, you will follow the same traffic pattern as the morning.

If you are picking up from the lower lot and your child is delayed in exiting the building, you will not be able to pull forward and wait like we currently do since that will halt all cars from exiting. If your child is late, you will be asked to continue on and pull into the upper lot. Your child will walk up the sidewalk that leads from the school to the upper lot.

The change in traffic pattern is currently scheduled to begin on April 2nd, so for us, we will be implementing these new procedures when we return from the Easter break. Of course we will have additional faculty and staff positioned to assist as this starts.



There has been much in the news this week as we are set to mark the one year anniversary of when our world turned upside down with the closing of schools for in-person instruction due to the onset of the global coronavirus pandemic.

It is amazing to reflect back on the days leading up to the closure when there was much conjecture as to whether the schools in Virginia would close. I recall making the decision, out of an abundance of caution, to send our students home with all of their books on Thursday, March 12th, but thinking we would be back the next day. We pushed forward that evening with the middle school musical and then it happened, we received word that indeed schools were closing. We took Friday, March 13th as a day off from school; the students had Monday, March 16th off as teachers turned on a dime and prepared for online learning. And, on Tuesday,

March 17th we were up and running with asynchronous learning taking place.

I continue to marvel at the resiliency of our teachers and staff, but just as equally of our students and parents. Teachers dedicated themselves to seeing that the major curriculum concepts were completed and they implemented as quickly as possible resources and platforms that would move the learning forward. The endless creativity of teachers came forward with videos of lessons and we relished the continued prayer services and other special events during the months leading to June.

The phrase, "parents are the primary educators of their children" took on a whole new meaning. The sacrifices that parents made in their daily schedules in order to provide a routine and structure for their children was paramount in us being able to find any and all success.

The PTO was pivotal in making sure we were (and still are) #holyspiritstrong. They pressed forward with the Talent Show and provided behind the scenes support to the teachers on a regular basis.

We were thrilled to provide an in-person graduation Mass and ceremony for the class of 2020 and we looked forward to the days when we caught glimpses of our students and families in person as they drove through the campus or lunched on the lawn out front.

The summer months brought there own stressors as we navigated the requirements of opening our school for in-person instruction. Sadly, the year's policies and procedures meant not having some of our families return, but the opportunity to open brought us new families and friendships and the ability to spread the joy of Catholic education to many who had not been a part of it before.

I look forward to continuing the year and finding ways to open up and reimplement some of the "traditional" ways we have done things. Keeping our community healthy is key to this happening.

I think the week's warm weather has renewed our optimism that school life will continue to open itself up and that Holy Spirit School and Catholic education will emerge stronger. It is faith that has brought us through it all and it is faith that we will always stand on as the foundation of all we do.



Thank you to those who have made our tree project a part of your Lenten sacrifice. We have thus far raised just over \$1,500.00!

# So, will we keep going? Of course!

As you might imagine, a project like this has many components to it, so although we have reached the initial goal of raising enough money for the seeds, we will now look to contribute to other needs. This project lists items from wheelbarrows, to watering cans, to plant food, etc. so, we will continue on in order to make the biggest impact we can.

Through charitable works and sacrifices, help us to raise \$1500.00 this Lenten season to purchase seeds for 6000 trees to populate a tree nursery near a newly built village in Balan, Haiti.

Operation Starfish was established in 1998 by Nativity Parish in Burke. Since its inception, 11 "Nativity Villages" have been completed and the 12th is nearing completion. Operation Starfish works in close connection with Food for the Poor to accomplish their ambitious goals.

Our own Ms. Garcia (PreK teacher) has participated in this mission work and has had the privilege of traveling to Haiti.

As we continue to explore and expand on this year's theme of caring for God's creation, this is a wonderful example for the children how the good works of ourselves and others can have a positive and lasting impact on the lives of others.

The current village is being built in Balan and the project goal is to plant 6000 trees—primarily

fruit and moringa trees which are high in fibre, zinc, and help regulate blood sugar. This project will help with reforestation, soil erosion, and provide shade. The trees will also absorb pollutants, and provide oxygen through photosynthesis. In addition, they will be a food source.

So, how is this a Lenten project?

Teachers will be explaining the project to the children and showing them a part of a video so they can see the village under construction and "meet" some of the families who are beneficiaries. We are hoping that through small sacrifices (for instance, if your family decides to forgo eating out during Lent, that a small portion of what is saved might be donated to the cause. Or, if your child decides to "add" to their Lenten journey by doing something extra at home to help out, that some small change might be provided that they can then donate.

Collection containers will be available in the classrooms and we will track, as a school, our progress.

Truly this is not meant to be just a donation, but instead a great way to converse with your child about the season of Lent and the ultimate sacrifice that Our Lord made for us.






