One more week to go...

The teachers have begun arriving back at school...early! We are all so very excited to start the year and to see the smiling faces of all of our students and to hear all about what they have been doing over the summer.

I've left below the schedules for the various grade levels for the first week of school for your reference.

Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, the Diocese of Arlington has adopted at all of the schools the Scantron Performance Series as the diagnostic and placement tool for grades 3-7 replacing the Terra Nova testing. Formative assessments have always been used in education and are regularly embedded into everyday instruction. Formative assessments are critical to student learning in that they provide timely feedback to teachers on where a student is on the learning spectrum for any particular skill. Student success and mastery is not measured as a fixed point and instead learning is on a continuum.

The Scantron Performance series is a web-based, computeradaptive test which provides teachers specific information for targeted intervention and more individualized instruction. A computer-adaptive test means that each student's assessment will look different. As students answer questions either correctly or incorrectly, the computer will "know" the accuracy of the answer and will then set the next question at a comparable, higher, or lower level. The usual length of each of the assessments will be about 45 minutes.

The assessment will be given multiple times over the course of the year as a part of a regular class period (no more "shutting down" the school for Terra Nova testing week). Assessments in mathematics, reading, and language arts will be given. Information gained over multiple assessments will provide a more accurate, truer measurement of academic growth as opposed to the one-time a year Spring summative assessment that Terra Nova provided.

We have been discussing, as a faculty, the change over to this assessment tool since last year and the teachers will be receiving training on not only the administration of the test but on the interpretation of the data.

The first assessment "window" will open in September. Results for each student in grades 3-7 will be discussed at the November conferences.

Attached below is "A Parent's Guide to Performance Series" provided by the Diocese for your review. I will continue to provide additional information as we progress with new program.

Back to School Family Packet

If you are unable to attend the Open House on the 26th, the packet will be sent home with your child on the first day of school.



Carpool

Carpool is always a challenge the first few days of school but it does get better quickly. If everyone could please follow the below reminders it would be a great help:

During morning drop-off, no students should be dropped off prior to 7:45 am. Teachers do not go on duty outside until 7:45 am (please note we work by the bell/clock within the school). No students should be dropped off in the upper parking lot and allowed to walk down the sidewalk to the front of the school. I know everyone is busy and has somewhere to be but for the safety of everyone involved all cars should come through the front car line. (This excludes Prekindergarten families who drop-off in the rear of the school.)

The drop-off line moves much faster if students are ready to go when you reach the sidewalk. Parents should stay in the car and allow teachers to assist the students. All students must exit on the right side of the car so they step immediately onto the sidewalk. Regardless of where your child's class lines-up, please have your child get out of the car at the first spot at which you stop along the sidewalk; do not make multiple drop-offs or stops.

In the afternoon, please be sure that you are filling in one line at a time and I ask that you be cognizant of not cutting into a line in front of others who have been patiently waiting.

Parents may not park in the upper lot and walk down to retrieve students from the front of the school. Again, I understand that many are in a hurry and have places to be but for safety and out of fairness all should wait in the carpool line.

As after school activities begin and more children begin attending Extended Day, the carpool line will return to its usual 10-15 minute "event".

Vanpool

During the first week of school the vanpool slots for last year will be used with the EXCEPTION of kindergarteners who are now first graders. These students will be dismissed with the regular carpool unless they are in a group vanpool.

The new vanpool slots will be sent home on Friday, September 2nd. Current kindergarten families will receive their slot during kindergarten orientation.
