Moving Quickly Through the Month of May

We are certainly moving quickly through the month of May! Personally, I had been hopeful that our area would move into Phase I of reopening this week, but will patiently wait another two weeks. I think the turn of the weather to warmer temperatures will assist with being patient.

As we move to the end of the academic year, I hear often from neighbors, in the news media, etc. that this has been a "trying" time - and I thinks folks are correct, but for Holy Spirit I prefer to think of the "trying" in a positive way. Teachers have been "trying" new methods of providing instruction; students have been "trying" (very successfully) to adapt to learning online; parents and guardians have been "trying" to identify new and novel ways to keep children engaged in the learning. All the way around, everyone should give themselves a huge pat on the back as we continue moving forward.

The pacing of the days through the month of May also brings questions about what the academic term 2020/2021 will look like. I wish at this point that I had all of the answers for everyone, but that is not possible at this time. What I can tell you is that Holy Spirit School will be here and will be ready for whatever the new year looks like.

We have been and will continue to receive direction from the Governor of

the Commonwealth of Virginia, as well as from the Office of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Arlington (who works closely with the Virginia Council for Private Education). We will certainly be looking and studying what the surrounding Counties are doing, but will be making decisions and preparing plans that are best suited to our unique community.

I put together weeks ago a committee of faculty members whose task is to brainstorm and discuss ideas as to how we will not just approach the academic teaching but how we may have to change/adapt many of the basic procedures for the school from arrival and dismissal to recess and lunch to Mass attendance to general movement in the hallways, etc. Additionally, I have and will continue to engage stakeholders in our school community as we put together our plans in order to receive feedback. Please note that there has been no specific guidance at this time as to numbers of students in a classroom at a given time and the impact that may have on scheduling.

Of paramount concern to me and the faculty is the delivery of instruction. Having been thrown into a situation/reality that we were not best positioned for, I have to applaud the efforts of the teachers, students, and families for, as the saying goes, making lemonade out of lemons. I am hugely cognizant that not everything has gone smoothly for all families and that the learning curve for some faculty members in terms of effectively using technology was greater than for others.

With that being said, as we prepare for next year, we are looking at multiple scenarios which include both school beginning in the physical building in August and school beginning online. We are also thinking in terms of scenarios that involve students being in and out of the building for various periods of time especially through the Fall and into the Winter. With the possibility of that happening, we are keenly aware of the need for there to be more seamless transitions between school and home.

To that end, Mrs. Evans and I have met with Father O'Donohue, the Parish Business Manager, and the school's IT vendor, Manus Dei to discuss the acquisition of additional devices (iPads and Chromebooks) such that we will have a device available for each student to take home for use during periods of distance learning thus making it possible (while working within the framework and policies outlined by the Diocese) to provide increased synchronous or "live" teaching with the caveat that having a student on a device live with a teacher for 4/5 hours a day will not happen.

Just making a device available to a student though does not rectify all of the challenges of distance learning. The faculty committee has been and will be spending time on identifying effective professional development for the teachers to provide not just practical tools but also information on how we change our mindset and some of our current pedagogy as we look to truly move to a blended learning approach that effectively incorporates the developmentally appropriate use of technology for students while maintaining effective traditional methods of teaching and learning. We are also cognizant that the training needs to extend to parents/guardians such that you are armed with the knowledge necessary to help guide your children during times of distance learning. In this vein, we are also discussing the platform(s) that may be used for delivery of instruction, i.e. PowerLearning, Google Classroom, etc.

As you intuitively know, this is all taking time and is being done as quickly as we can prudently move while also taking care of all of the daily learning and important events that are scheduled to take place between now and the end of this academic year.

Ultimately, there is a significant financial investment in order to "make" all of this work. Father O'Donohue and I are acutely aware of the financial sacrifices that families make in order to have their children attend Holy Spirit School. To that end, due to the continued dedication that families have had to making timely tuition payments, we have been able to keep all eligible school employees "employed" and paid during this period of time. With the continued support of the parish all of the ongoing bills of the school (utilities, cleaning company, etc.) are paid on time and the expenses associated with additional teaching resources and online platforms that have been necessary during these past couple of months have been met; for example, the subscription and licensing for the Zoom for Education platform was an approximate \$4000.00 expense and as we look to sending devices home with students there are costs outside of the acquisition that pertain to management and security.

We are constantly looking at and running the financial numbers for the school. We do not foresee a change to the publicized tuition rates although we have spoken about a nominal increase in the technology fee in order to help cover a portion of the cost of what will be needed. A decision about that will be made and articulated to families prior to start of the new school year.

I know that this has been long and yet, in no way is answering all of the questions that everyone has. If nothing else, please know that as not just an educational institution, but as a partner in the faith formation of your children, we are looking forward to what really can be an exciting and adventurous new path. I cannot diminish my gratitude for your support of Holy Spirit and the trust that you have put in us.

I look forward to seeing everyone in the weeks to come as we wrap up the year and move into the days of returning materials. (It will be kind of like daily morning car line!)

We will receive final guidance from the Office of Catholic Schools as to whether report cards will be electronic or mailed home and will relay that to you. It is important that students continue to complete assignments and turn them in to their teachers. Progress of learning is the benchmark that has been reiterated to the principals during our regular meetings with OCS.

Thank you for all you are doing and for your continued support of Holy Spirit School.




The Virtual 5K begins tomorrow -Friday, May 15th!


