Tuesday, June 2nd (following the car parade) 8th graders only (Masks/face coverings must be worn when exiting the car.)

Cars will line up in the lower lot in the traditional car line pattern.

Stations will be set up to facilitate an orderly return.

Students will follow a predetermined pattern and move from station to station.

Textbooks and other materials for particular classes will be returned to the specific teacher.

A station for donating used uniforms will be present.

The last station will be where students will be given a bag, labeled with their name, of items that were collected from lockers and/or desks.

Please note that if your child has lost or damaged (beyond normal wear and tear) any textbooks, you will be billed for the replacement of them. Final transcripts will not be sent to high schools until all financial obligations to the school are met.

Wednesday, June 3rd - 1:00 - 3:00 pm 6th and 7th graders only (Masks/face coverings must be worn when exiting the car.)

Cars will line up in the lower lot in the traditional car line pattern.

Stations will be set up to facilitate an orderly return.

Students will follow a predetermined pattern and move from station to station.

Textbooks and other materials for particular classes will be returned to the specific teacher.

A station for donating used uniforms will be present.

The last station will be where students will be given a bag, labeled with their name, of items that were collected from lockers and/or desks.

Grade 5 - cars should enter the campus using the 1st entrance on Woodland Way and line up in the lower parking lot in the traditional car line pattern.

Teachers will be stationed such that as you pull through, they will hand you student belongings and receive back textbooks, etc.

Donations of used uniforms must be in a separate bag with a label indicating uniform donation. All uniforms must be clean and in good condition.

Please note that if your child has lost or damaged (beyond normal wear and tear) any textbooks, you will be billed for the replacement of them.

Friday, June 5th - 1:00 - 3:00 pm Grades Pk - 2 (No students or family members should exit cars.)

Grade 2 - cars should enter the campus using the 2nd entrance on Woodland Way that goes to the back of the school.

Grade 1 - cars should enter the campus using the 1st entrance on Woodland Way and follow the signage and directions to flow through the upper parking lot.

Kindergarten and Prekindergarten - cars should enter the campus using the 1st entrance on Woodland Way and line up in the lower parking lot in the traditional car line pattern. Watch for directional signs as to which line to get into when you arrive.


Teachers will be stationed such that as you pull through, they will hand you student belongings and receive back textbooks, etc.

Congregation size is strictly limited to a maximum of up to 50% seating capacity with social distancing of at least six feet. (Families and members of the same household are exempt from these six-foot social distancing requirements.)
