Formation in Christian Chastity Classes Begin Next

During the week of October 14th all students in grades 1-8 will have presented to them the information included in the Diocesan Formation in Christian Chastity program. This is an opt-out program meaning that families must specifically sign and turn in the waiver asking for their child to be exempted from the program.

In PowerLearning on the Family Information page there is a tab for Formation in Christian Chastity. The form is there. For those looking for information about the program, there is a link on the same page which takes you to the Diocese of Arlington website. Please note that for many of the grades levels the same lesson is used but the focus of the lesson changes as the child gets older. If you look at the parent letter for the grade level under the section, "What could parents teach to [insert grade here] Graders?" that will give a better explanation of what is being taught. For instance, in 1st grade, the focus is on creation, in 2nd grade, the theme is the human person as a child of God, etc.




