April is National Child Abuse Prevention month. The 2023 data related to child protection and related subjects is now being released by various organizations. The below resources were sent to school via the Diocesan Office of Child and Youth Protection.

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC)

NCMEC launched an interactive video with the purpose of providing a "new interactive experience that plunges parents and caregivers into the reality of financial sextortion, coinciding with the release of new data on child sexual exploitation." Very well done.

Additionally, NCMEC released its **2023** *Impact Report* today with surprising new numbers concerning threats to our youth:

Reports of online enticement increased by more than 300 percent between 2021 and 2023;

- NCMEC's CyberTipline received 36.2 million reports of suspected child sexual exploitation online in 2023; and
- NCMEC assisted law enforcement, families, and child welfare with 28,886 cases of missing children with an 88 percent recovery rate in 2023.

Our rolling list of reminders!

The 5th and 8th graders will be taking the **ACRE assessment** on Tuesday, April 23 and Wednesday, April 24th.

For those unfamiliar with ACRE, since the late 1970's the National Catholic Education Association has offered assessment instruments designed to strengthen catechetical/religious education programs. The ACRE (Assessment of Children/Youth Religious Education) helps schools, parishes and diocesan leaders evaluate the faith knowledge and attitudes of students in Catholic schools. As an integrated assessment tool, ACRE provides faith knowledge questions and questions related to religious beliefs, attitudes, practices, and perceptions. This tool that provides national scores for comparison and processes for tracking religious education program data over time.

Trimester 3 interims will go home on Friday, April 26th.

On Friday, May 3rd we will have our second **Nothing But Faith Day** of the year. The concentration will be on Pentecost.

The **Spring testing session** for NWEA begins Monday, May 6th and goes through Friday, May 24th. This testing is for grades 3-7; parents, watch for information from the classroom teacher as to which days/times your student will be testing.

The 8th grade will attend the annual **Vocations Mass** along with all of the 8th graders across the Diocese. This is a wonderful Mass celebrated by Bishop Burbdge as the students spend time contemplating and discerning the call God has for them.

The 8th grade will be taking the **Spanish Language High School Placement Exam** on May 9th. Students should be sure to be here on time as the exam begins promptly at 8:15 am.

We will **celebrate all of the mothers and women in our lives**on Friday, May 10th with Mass and receptions in the classrooms. See the flyer below with detail information.

The 8th grade will head to St. Paul VI High School to participate in the annual **Diocesan Shakespeare Festival** on May 20th.

Thursday, May 16th is the next PTO Spirit Gear Day.

We will also be attending Mass this day at 1:30pm to assist in opening the parish's **40 Hours Prayer Devotion**. Bishop Burbidge asks parishes to provide this opportunity for continuous public prayer in the presence of the Most Blessed Sacrament.



Reminders


