Considering that there are only 300 families in the school and 40 of them are prekindergarten families who drop off in the back of the school, it can be said there are a significant number of students who are not benefiting from having time in their homeroom classroom to get settled and begin the day without rushing.

Believe me, I understand what it is like to get children up, moving, and out of the house, but I encourage families to plan for sleepy and tired children and traffic in order to arrive before that bell rings.
