It's August!!!!

Wow! Where have the weeks of Summer gone?

It is hard to believe in just a few short weeks we will launch our 2022/2023 school year. I pray you are enjoying the time away from school and that you and your children are ready to embrace the new school year and all of the excitement that it holds. We welcome back our returning Holy Spirit families and all those who are new to our community – we look forward to getting to know everyone.

The faculty has chosen the theme of "Joy" as we highlight throughout this Fruit of the Holy Spirit throughout the year. We look forward to continuing to provide opportunities for the students both in and out of classrooms to live the Catholic Faith and to grow in their service to others.

We have a couple of new teaching assignments for the year. Mrs. Molly Guthrie will move to the Resource Department to take over responsibilities as a Reading Resource teacher. Mrs. Shelia Moran moves into a Resource Teacher role as she pursues her licensure in Special Education. Mrs. Patti Zamiska will move into the lead teacher role in one of the prekindergarten classrooms. Mrs. Ann Marie Brown is sliding out from Extended Day into the role of prekindergarten aide.

We also have new faculty and staff members with us this year. In the primary grades the following folks are joining us: Ms. Noelle Hickey in Kindergarten; Mrs. Susan Epperly in

2nd grade; Mrs. Maria Monterroso as a prekindergarten aide; and Mrs. Kirsten Kovak as a 1st grade aide. In the intermediate grades, Ms. Caroline Cahill joins us in 3rd grade and Mrs. Karen Bush in 5th grade. In the middle school, Mr. John Ferguson will have responsibilities as a 6th grade homeroom teacher and will take on the Social Studies classes; Mrs. Christina Slifko will also be a 6th grade homeroom teacher and will take on the Social Studies 6th grade Religion and 8th grade Language Arts; and Mr. Guizen Del Canto will be a 7th grade homeroom teacher and will have responsibility for 8th grade Religion and 7th grade Language Arts. In the "Specials" arena, Ms. Cathleen Sanborn will be the music instructor for school; Mrs. Ellen Coney will make a home for herself in the library; and Ms. Elizabeth Stevenson will take over the technology instructor role. In the Resource Department, Mrs. Melanie Bennett joins us a para-educator.

We are still seeking a 1st grade teacher and an additional para-educator.

If, by chance, your student has not completed his/her summer work, now would be great time to be sure students are on track to have everything finished as most everything is due either the first day or first week of school.

If you have a rising kindergartener or are a new family to the school, all required medical forms must be returned as soon as possible. School law prohibits school attendance without the required documentation. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Forrer.

On August 17th at 6:00 pm the NEW family social sponsored by the PTO will be held on the lawn out in front of the school. We invite all new families (parents and children) to join us.

That night, the PTO is also sponsoring the Roaming Coyote food truck; see the PTO section of the newsletter for details.

On August 23rd there will be an opportunity to meet the teachers, find out homeroom assignments and take a peek at the classrooms. Arrival times are split up to give students a bit more time to really see their teacher. Families with last names from A-M are invited to come by the school between 11:00 am – 12:00 pm. Families with last names from N-Z are invited between 1:00-2:00 pm. We look forward to seeing all of you then and ask that you please not come to school for an extra early sneak peek as the teachers and administrators will be very busy with meetings and classroom set-up.

If you are interested in either Morning Care or Extended Day, the registration document is available on the website, you may send that in now and you will be billed the registration fee via FACTS.

Paperwork needed for the start of the school year will be available for pickup during the August 23rd Meet Your Teacher event. Please return all forms on Wednesday, August 24th.

For **Grades 1-8** Wednesday, August 24th is an 11:30 am dismissal; the rest of the week are full days. No School lunches will be provided the first week of school.

School for **Grades 1-8** begins on August 24th at 8:00 am. Please make every effort to begin the good habit of arriving on time. Drop off begins at 7:40 am; I will see you in the parking lot! Teachers will meet the students outside and escort them to their classrooms. Parents are asked to say their goodbyes as they drop their children off in the carline. (If you want to park and watch from the upper lot after you drop off your children you are welcome to.) Please refer to the handbook that will be posted on the school website for complete directions on arrival and pickup procedures. During the first week of school the vanpool slots for last year will be used with the EXCEPTION of kindergarteners who are

now first graders. These students will be dismissed with the regular carpool unless they are in a group vanpool that used a non-kindergarten slot. Applications for vanpool slots will be sent home in the beginning of the year packet.

A **kindergarten parent meeting** (no students) is scheduled for Wednesday, August 24^{th} at 8:30 am. Kindergartners' first day will be Thursday, August 25^{th} , from 8:00 – 11:30 am (with no afternoon Extended Day for them this first day). The remainder of the week is full days.

The **prekindergarten parent meeting** (no students) is at 9:30 am on Wednesday, August 24th. The prekindergarten orientation for the students and parents is on Thursday, August 25th. Students with last names beginning A through L are asked to come from 9:00 – 9:45 am and students with last names beginning with M through Z are asked to come from 10:00 – 10:45 am. Classes begin for prekindergarten on Friday, August 26th; this is a half day for all PreK students with dismissal at 11:30am (there is no afternoon Extended Day for PreK this first day).

Morning Care will be open at 7:00 am on the first day of school. Morning care is located in the cafeteria. Families should park in the rear of the building and access the cafeteria via the back doors. Grade levels may begin using Morning Care on the following dates:

Grades 1-8 – may begin using Morning Care on Wednesday, August 24th Kindergarten – may begin using Morning Care on Thursday, August 25th PreKindergarten – may begin using Morning Care on Friday, August 26th

Afternoon Extended Care for all grades will begin in the cafeteria. Grade levels may begin using Afternoon Extended Care on the following dates:

Grades 1-8 – may begin using Extended Day on Wednesday, August 24th Kindergarten – may begin using Extended Day on Friday, August 26th PreKindergarten – may begin using Extended Day on Monday, August 29th Afternoon Extended Day is closed completely on Friday, September 2nd due to the early dismissal prior to the Labor Day weekend.

Welcome Letter 2022

Please find below a letter from Dr. Joseph Vorbach, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Arlington with regard to the current guidance on COVID-19.

Superintendent Letter



As the school year closed in June, the owner of Surefire Catering let me know that he would not be returning to our building nor would he be continuing the association we had with him regarding school lunches.

On the advice of the general counsel for the Diocese of Arlington, it was decided that we would not rent out the kitchen space to a new in-house caterer. Therefore research was done of food service companies and our options.

Ultimately, the decision to partner with School Eatery was made.

As we finish the onboarding process with the company, information on establishing family accounts will be provided. Families will order directly from the company via a portal with all costs and fees being collected by the company (i.e. there will no longer be Boonli accounts for school families).

Lunches will be boxed and labeled by the company and delivered to the school in order to be distributed at each lunch period.

Again, as logistics are finalized, information will be provided as to account set-up and the start date for hot lunches.

This arrangement does not impact milk or water purchases. Information on costs for those items will be in the family packet and the one time purchase cost will be collected via FACTS.



Music to our ears!

Both the Band and Strings programs will return for the 22/23 academic year.

Dr. Hwan-Ah Lee will continue as the instructor for the Strings program. Students in 3rd grade

and above are eligible for this program.

We welcome back the Garwood Whaley Music Program this year. The Band program, which is open to students in grades 4 and above will be led by Dr. Joseph Howell.

Dr. Howell is a Doctor of Musical Arts and Veteran of US Navy Fleet Bands. After his schooling, Dr. Howell worked as a music teacher and musician, first in San Diego and then in the Washington DC area. A few years later, he served a four-year enlistment in the US Navy, performing and deploying all over Asia with the Seventh Fleet Band. While abroad, he also performed as a solo artist and clinician in Japan, India, Singapore, and Hong Kong, and wrote audio review articles for the International Clarinet Association.

As a teacher, Dr. Howell has taught music for over twenty years. In addition to having taught beginning band classes at both public and private schools, he has taught classes, masterclasses, ensembles, and private lessons at all levels, including college. Dr. Howell focuses on strengthening musical fundamentals, and uses humor and kindness to keep lessons as fun as possible!

We look forward to getting to know Dr. Howell and re-establishing our always strong band program.

Instrument demonstrations for both programs will take place on August 31st during school hours and information for interested students will be provided.




Headphone/Earbuds



Registering for Connect1 at Holy Spirit School

How to sign up for an account on Connect1:

- 1. On your computer, go to https://app.connect1.io
- 2. Click the green bar that says "Sign up (School Code).



- 3. Enter your email address. Enter our school code, which is L41VP6. (Are you both a teacher and a parent at the school? You'llneed to set up two accounts. One using your "holyspiritflames.org" email account for you role as a teacher, and your personal one for your role as a parent!)
- 4. This will open a new page where you enter your name, role and password. For Role, select "Parent/Community Member". (Unless you are a teacher creating your account with your "holyspiritflames.org" account. In that case, please select "Faculty/School Employee".) Click Submit when you are done.
- Anew page opens. AConfirmation Code will be sent to your email. Copy that confirmation code and paste it into this page. Click Confirm.
- This brings you back to the Sign In page. Enter your email address and newly created password to open the app.








Are you interested in joining Cub Scouts this fall? Learn leadership skills, what is means to be a good citizen, how to care for and explore God's creation in nature, and so much more.
