Refocusing in order to stay in school

As we quickly race towards the last four months of school (where has the time gone?!), I thought it a good idea to take a bit of "space" this week to refocus on our efforts to keep the school open.

As you all know when we put out our reopening plan way back in July, it included a number of mitigation strategies which we hoped would help us stay open - and we have been wildly successful to date. Have there been cases of COVID among the population at the school, yes; but what we have been able to successfully do thus far is avoid on a large scale what is referred to as "community spread".

My concern though, and hence writing this out, is that as we move in on one year since our world so suddenly and drastically changed, we are all beyond weary of having our lifestyles hampered. And that weariness is prompting us to go more places, engage in more activities, and interact with more and more people either directly or indirectly. Do I begrudge people that? No.

Am I also fully cognizant that folks can feel like they are doing everything "right" and still have family members who test positive? Yes.

The concept of community spread in our school manifests itself most dramatically in the number of homeroom classrooms that can be impacted when a student tests positive. The likelihood of a multi-classroom event is great here due, in part, to the considerable number of families that have multiple children in the school and when a positive case spreads amongst siblings.

When a student tests positive, it isn't just the student who tested positive who has to stay

home, but it is the students who sit directly around him/her or, depending on age, larger groups up to whole classrooms. These students, as you know, are out anywhere from 10 days (for the positive student) to 14 days for those considered "exposed" or longer depending on circumstances. Fourteen days is a long time to not be in school - even with the best efforts of teachers to connect with students, there is no substitute for in-person instruction.

All of this is being said, not because I am looking to take anyone to task, but instead, because of the very fact that we HAVE come so far in this academic year. I have asked the teachers to double down on cleaning and hand washing, as well as on reminders for wearing masks properly and reminding students to distance as much as possible while also realizing that they are children who naturally gravitate to one another. We can only do so much though and we continue to count on you.

Whether for a single case or multiple cases, I am mandated to interact with the Fairfax County Health Department and to implement their recommendations. Although the contract tracer who works with us is very friendly and, I truly believe cheering for our success, I would very much like to diminish my conversations with him.

As I have been doing all year long, I watch our cases and numbers carefully and continue to make the best and most prudent decisions for the school that I am able. The big-time goal is to make it to June! I am thankful for the counsel of our two assistant principals, as well as our pastor as we continue to navigate not just this year, but the coming years.

I appreciate you reading this and continuing to support us with both your words and actions. And as we move towards the next logical travel time - Easter break - I would ask that you continue to consider the impact that not just travel, but family and friend gatherings can unintentionally have on our school community.



Through charitable works and sacrifices, help us to raise \$1500.00 this Lenten season to purchase seeds for 6000 trees to populate a tree nursery near a newly built village in Balan, Haiti.

Operation Starfish was established in 1998 by Nativity Parish in Burke. Since its inception, 11 "Nativity Villages" have been completed and the 12th is nearing completion. Operation Starfish works in close connection with Food for the Poor to accomplish their ambitious goals.

Our own Ms. Garcia (PreK teacher) has participated in this mission work and has had the privilege of traveling to Haiti.

As we continue to explore and expand on this year's theme of caring for God's creation, this is a wonderful example for the children how the good works of ourselves and others can have a positive and lasting impact on the lives of others.

The current village is being built in Balan and the project goal is to plant 6000 trees—primarily fruit and moringa trees which are high in fibre, zinc, and help regulate blood sugar. This project will help with reforestation, soil erosion, and provide shade. The trees will also absorb pollutants, and provide oxygen through photosynthesis. In addition, they will be a food source.

So, how is this a Lenten project?

Teachers will be explaining the project to the children and showing them a part of a video so they can see the village under construction and "meet" some of the families who are beneficiaries. We are hoping that through small sacrifices (for instance, if your family decides to forgo eating out during Lent, that a small portion of what is saved might be donated to the cause. Or, if your child decides to "add" to their Lenten journey by doing something extra at home to help out, that some small change might be provided that they can then donate.

Collection containers will be available in the classrooms and we will track, as a school, our progress.

Truly this is not meant to be just a donation, but instead a great way to converse with your child about the season of Lent and the ultimate sacrifice that Our Lord made for us.






