Tomorrow is FIELD DAY! And, yes, it is quite possibly the BEST day of the year!

A few reminders from the Field Day PTO Committee:

**Field Day T-Shirts will be distributed to students (Kindergarten – 7<sup>th</sup> grade) on Field Day morning in their homerooms.** Pre-K does not participate in Field Day except for pizza lunch and ice cream sandwiches.

**Students should wear their gym uniforms and comfortable running shoes.** Keep in mind they may get wet and dirty.

Students may bring **labeled** hats and sunglasses.

We will have water stations and cups. However, students may bring appropriately sized, labeled water bottles. **Please do not bring any other drinks besides water, as they may attract bees.**

**Apply sunscreen** to your students **before they come to school!** Sunscreen containers are not allowed at school.

Please ensure that your children eat an appropriate breakfast to prepare them for a day of physical activity.

**Food:** We will provide popsicles during morning break, Domino's Pizza and water for lunch, and ice cream sandwiches during the afternoon. Students who are allergic to any of these items should bring their own snacks/lunches.

**Medical Conditions:** In the event that any children are currently suffering from some type of temporary physical disability or injury, or are currently wearing or using any assistive device, they will not compete in Field Day for their safety. Other accommodations will be made for these students. For those who suffer from allergies, please take into consideration that we will be outside most of the day.

Field Day goes on rain or shine (hopefully shine)! We're looking forward to a day of fun!

**Thoughtful Moments**

**Why does Easter matter?**  
 Jesus died so that we might live. In fact, He died so that we might live forever. If we truly believe in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, that belief must cause us to live differently. Easter gives us confidence that the darkness in our past can be forgiven, our present has meaning, and we can have hope for the future. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most important event in human history.

**Come together in silence.**  
 Saint Teresa of Calcutta said, "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence." Once a week, turn off the television, computers, video games and telephones for fifteen minutes. Sit in silence together and listen for God's voice.

*"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but (Him) who sent me" (Mark 9:37).*



**Live with Easter joy throughout the year**

The Church gives us a whole season to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ on Easter, ending on Pentecost (May 28). Here are five ways to spread Easter joy beyond the season.

**Praise God daily together.** Christ's Resurrection is a source of hope. Without it, getting to Heaven would be impossible for us. Offer prayers of praise and thanksgiving together every day.

**Celebrate our new life.** Plant an indoor Easter garden that you can tend all year. Point out new leaves, blossoms, or shoots when they appear, and remember that Easter brings us all new life.

**Tell me a story.** Jesus told marvelous stories to help us understand God's love for us. Add



Jesus' stories to your regular bedtime story selection and help children fall asleep with sweet dreams of God's love.

**Fast before the feast.** The pain of Good Friday makes the joy at Easter more intense. Observe every Friday as a day of penance.

For example, in addition to abstaining from meat, consider making Friday night a no-dessert or a no-computer game night. Then, on Sunday, treat yourselves to whatever you gave up.

**Celebrate Easter every week.** At every Mass, we receive the Resurrected Christ. He is as present to us as He was to Mary Magdalene outside the tomb. Don't miss a chance to celebrate "Little Easter" every Sunday.

**Why Do Catholics Do That?**

**Why are roses associated with Mary?**

For centuries, Our Lady has been associated with roses, traditionally considered the "queen" of flowers in Europe and the Middle East for their beauty, nobility, delicacy, and fragrance. They have also been linked to royalty, in apparitions.

Mary has appeared with roses at Lourdes, Guadalupe, and La Salette. One of her titles is "Mystical Rose." This connection was so strong, people compared praying sets of Hail Marys to a "wreath of roses" called a "rosarium"—now known as the Rosary.



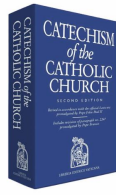


