Thoughts from Father O'Donohue

(Moving forward we will have a monthly contribution from our Pastor as we all seek to continue to grow and develop on our Faith journey.)

The season of Advent is almost upon us. It begins this Sunday. Advent is a four-week liturgical season of spiritual preparation for the coming of Christ Jesus. This year the season of Advent is as short as it can be. Because Christmas falls on a Monday this year, this means the Fourth Week of Advent is celebrated only on the Fourth Sunday of Advent; it's only a one-day week.

This means this year every day of Advent is all the more precious. The special grace of the season of Advent is to spiritually prepare us to celebrate the coming of Christ Jesus. It is not meant to be a season in which we *already* celebrate his coming. With Christmas Day, that new birthday season of celebration commences. If we ignore Advent or allow the celebration of Christmas to already dominate our lives, our spiritual preparation is guaranteed to be shallow and inadequate, lacking in the depth and riches that the grace of the Advent season provide.

So I encourage all of our school families to make the most of the Advent Season. Advent wreathes, Advent calendars, a Nativity scene in which the baby Jesus does not make his appearance until Christmas Day, and Advent music are all some of the ways to enrich the season. Family traditions that involve these and other devotions can leave such a lasting imprint on a person's life and soul, helping to unite families in faith an devotion.

Yes, there is an expectant joy that grows as Christmas comes closer, but there is also a somber dimension to the season. The color of the season is violet, reflecting in a visual way a sense of mourning and sadness as we are reminded that the Son of God came down from heaven and took on mortal flesh precisely because of our sins. St. John the

Baptist is one of the great and essential saints of the Advent season. Every Second Sunday of Advent he makes his appearance in the Gospel, preparing the way of the Lord by proclaiming a baptism for the forgiveness of sins (Mk 1:4). Jesus comes as Savior to save us from our sins. As the angel of the Lord joyfully announced to the shepherds (and to us): "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk 2:11). So, lastly, please during this Advent season respond to the voice of St. John the Baptist by, as a family, celebrating the Sacrament of Confession. For one of the deepest and truest joys of Christmas is to know Jesus as Savior through his merciful forgiveness of our sins. May this Christmas joy be yours by heeding the Advent voice of the one ordained by God to prepare for the coming – the advent – of the Lord.

If you have children (especially prekindergarten or kindergarten age), please take the time to complete that application as soon as possible so that we retain spaces.

For current students, Holy Spirit uses continuous enrollment, so unless we hear from you that you will not be returning, we plan for your children to be here.

The tuition rates for the 2024/2025 academic year will be sent home next week. There is a re-registration fee that is assessed per student. The date for that being posted to family FACTS accounts will be in the information that comes to you regarding tuition. For those families who are not returning for next year, the packet will include an Intent Not to Return form that we ask that you complete and return.

Families interested in applying for tuition assistance for the 2024/2025 academic year, the FACTS application is open. The deadline for applying is March 13, 2024.





3rd Grade- "Town speople"




