Giving thanks leads to generous hearts

"What shall I return to the Lord for all His bounty to me?" (Psalm 116:12) We can never repay God for His gifts to us but we can show gratitude by sharing them with others in ways that glorify Him. During the Thanksgiving season, try these suggestions to make your holiday more meaningful:

- Offer prayers of gratitude.** moved when one of the ten lepers He healed came back to thank Him (Luke 17:15-19). Give thanks as a family every day this season by each offering gratitude for specific blessings received throughout the year.
- Go to Mass.** The word "eucharist" is from the Greek for "thanksgiving" or "gratitude." The Eucharist refers to the Mass and the Blessed Sacrament, the ultimate form of Thanksgiving. When we actively take part in the Mass -- praying with others, offering our own prayers, reverently receiving the Blessed Sacrament, joining in the singing -- we offer heartfelt Thanksgiving to God.
- Send it out.** Another tradition of Thanksgiving involves sending notes of appreciation and thanks to friends and loved ones, especially for kindness received throughout the year. Kind words are always a powerful and a much-needed gift.
- Share the blessings.** If you know of people without holiday plans, offer them a place at your table. Adding to your family circle is a powerful example of generosity.

Just as families remember important milestones, the Church's liturgical calendar recalls the history of our Catholic family. The feasts and seasons that draw us deeper into salvation history are reflected in the Mass vestments, readings, and music of our liturgical celebrations.

Five First Saturday Devotion

"God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart"
Mary, Mother of God

What is required for the Devotion?

Each part of the devotion should be made with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, on the first Saturday of five (5) consecutive months.

Go to confession – this can be up to either (8) days before or after the First Saturday itself.

Receive Holy Communion on the day itself, in a state of grace, with the intention of making reparation as above.

Recite five (5) decades of the Rosary.

Meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary for 15 minutes: this is not difficult, e.g. slowly read the Gospel account of the mysteries, or use a booklet on the Rosary.

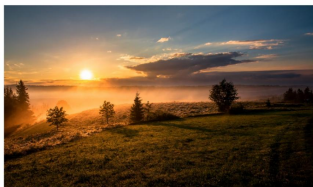



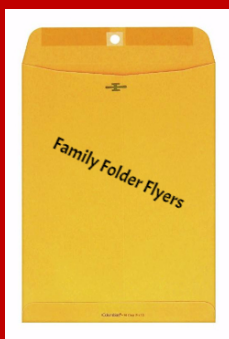
