Today was our first whole school assembly of the year and we recognized the International Day of Peace by praying together and creating our own pinwheels that represent what peace looks likes to us. Hopefully you took a peak at them this afternoon out on the front lawn!

Today was our first prayer service with Father Willard! We are pleased that he is a part of our community and look forward to him sharing his gifts and interests with us as we get to know him and he gets to know all of us.

This week we had our first opportunity to provide the Sacrament of Confession for the middle school students (next week will be grade 3-5). I encourage parents to make going to Confession a regular part of your family life in order to assist your children to grow in grace.

On October 3rd we will have our first (are you seeing the pattern here...) Nothing But Faith Day for this year. For those new to our community, we have two of these days on our school calendar. For these days we set aside our academic learning and spend the day focusing on a particular aspect of our Faith. For this upcoming day we will be highlighting the different forms of prayer in which we participate. We have a series of activites and presentations planned for the day.

Upcoming is our first dress down day of the year! The Holy Spirit School Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society is recognizing Childhood Cancer Awareness. Students are invited to participate by bringing in a \$1 dollar donation in order to be able to dress down for the day. Proceeds will be donated to charity. (Be sure to check the handbook for those apparel items and shoes that are and are not allowed for a dress down day.)

A reminder that we are almost through the first half of the 1st Trimester and as such interims will go home to those students in grades 3-8 who may be in need of those on Friday, October 6th.

Friday, October 6th is also a half day (afternoon Extended Day is OPEN) and Monday, October 9th is a school holiday in recognition of Columbus Day.

On Sunday, October 8th the school along with the parish will host the Porto Charities Annual Mass for Disability Awareness at 10:30 am. All are invited. Bishop Burbidge is scheduled to be the primary Celebrant and there will be a small reception following.

Who wouldn't want their kiddos to offer to do something more at home? But the challenge is relevant for all of us. Addressing the tragedy of abortion is the "preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed" (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, Introductory Letter).

REGISTER TO VOTE!

This fall, voters will elect Virginia General Assembly candidates — and in some areas — "downballot" offices. The deadline to register is **Monday, Oct. 16**.

Who is eligible to register?

• Must be a U.S. citizen.

• Must be a U.S. citizen.

• Must be a resident of Virginia.

• Must be 18 on or before the next election (e.g., 17-year-olds born on or before Nov. 7, 2005 can register today).

• Not be registered and plan to vote in another state.

In today's society, so many seem to have lost a sense of "sin," of "right" vs "wrong"

Sin is an offence against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is a failure in genuine love for God and neighbor caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods... It has been defined [by \$t Augustine] as "an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law." Catechism of the Catholic Church

So why do we have Confession, especially if God knows everything and knows we are sorry?

ession might be one of the most difficult parts of our faith for some of us. There is a big difference een God "knowing" what you did and His act of forgiveness.

For example, if you sinned against a friend and then felt sorry and guilty for that, it's possible that your friend would realize, just by knowing you, that you were truly sorry. But that doesn't mean that you can just presume your friend's goodness and forgiveness. The best thing to do is to actually tell your friend you are sorry and to have your friend tell you that you are forgiven.

So why do you need to confess sins to a priest? In St. John's Gospel, Jesus appeared to His Apostles after His Resurrection and said to them:

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; it you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Christ is saying that He is acting through the Apostles and since the Church is founded on Peter and the Apostles, the powers given to them are communicated to their successors, the priests.

And, Church law prohibits a priest from betraying a penitent in any way, for any reason. What you tell him in the confessional remains private forever no matter how serious it may be.



Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the priests of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord.




